INTRODUCTION : Origin of B. H. College :

The origin of B. H. College dates back to January 1964 when Jadab Chandra Das, an eminent citizen, mooted the idea for establishing a College at Howly. Accordingly, a public meeting was held at Howly Chandi Barua Bhawan with Abdul Kader Choudhury, (Mouzadar) as President, and all those who were present very much appreciated the idea and unanimously decided to establish the College at the earliest. It was further decided that the leading persons from different communities of Barpeta Road should also be apprised of the necessity of a College and a joint attempt be made for establishment of an "Ideal College" in this locality.

A general meeting of the representatives of Howly and Barpeta Road was held on 24-5-64 at 3 p.m. in the premises of G. N. B. Memorial High School, Barpeta Road, under the presidentship of the then Chairman of Barpeta Road Municipality Board, Mohanlal Choudhury and it was resolved that- "A college, an ideal college, be established with the co-operative efforts of the people of the Howly and Barpeta Road area for meeting the increasing demand for higher education of the people of this locality."

The first general public meeting was held on 12-6-64 at the G. N. B. Memorial High School premises under the Chairmanship of the then S.D.O. (Civil) Barpeta, Kamal Chandra Majumdar, who galvanized the spirit to see the idea realized.

Noble thoughts may take time to conceive but little time to deliver. In no time, the intense desire and untiring efforts of founding fathers lit the light of B. H. College initially only with Arts faculty in the year 1966. The selfless devotion & sacrifice of the local people have graduated this institution into a famous college in Assam and now it is standing with glory as their cherished offspring.

The opening of the Commerce faculty in 1973 and subsequently Science faculty in 1988 and post-graduation in Commerce in 1990 enabled this institution to emerge as the only full-fledged three faculty institution in Lower Assam under Gauhati University. The college was accorded UGC recognition in the year 1969 and it had also achieved the distinction of B⁺⁺ Accreditation by NAAC in 2003.

The strength of this institution lies in its academic achievements and healthy environment. A rural college, essentially catering to the academic needs of local youth coming from families of cultivators and poverty-stricken multitude, requires a very soft-careful managerial acumen in its build-up process. Our founder Principal Sri Satya Nath Das is the man who did the job with admirable success. The armature of this institution is strong enough to meet the growing challenges of Higher Education.

LOCATION :

Historically famous and conveniently situated, Barbarijhar Reserve is the location of the College. This Barbarijhar was originally the capital of Raghudev Rai, the son of Chilaraya, the brother of Koch King Narnarayan. It is situated in the middle point of Barpeta Road and Howly, on the western side of the N.H. 31. The College comprises 33 acres of land shaped in a semi-circular form and bordered by the dead river 'Manas'. The location of the College is far from the din and bustle of towns and cities. Valuable trees and lush-green vegetation lend to the institution a pastoral magnanimity and sylvan serenity. Though sequestered, the location of the College reminds us the concept of 'Sangrilla' or in other-words 'Gurukulashram'.

MISSION AND GOAL :

The institution aims at imparting knowledge of various disciplines amongst the youths of rural and semi-urban populace of the region to make them responsible and competent to face the challenges of modern world and contribute towards the upliftment of the society.

Besides, it endeavours to set an example of unity and integrity among different sections of people of the locality.

IMPORTANT FOR ALL STUDENTS OF SEMESTER COURSE

In the semester system students' performance will be monitored throughout the semester by continuous assessment in the theory and practical course. Evaluation of the students' performance in each of the theory and practical paper will be based on the following :

Internal Evaluation : 20% Marks

External Evaluation : 80% Marks

Internal evaluation will be based on sessional examinations, home assignments, seminars, group discussion and library work in each semester. External evaluation shall be through a final examination at the end of the semester. In each paper, students must secure pass mark on both the internal as well as the external evaluation separately.

Every student must complete minimum of 30 credits per week in a semester, this amounts to about 30 hours of contact teaching per week.

However, class attendance must be at least 75% of the classes held throughout the semester. There will be regular lecture classes as well as tutorial classes. However, for the tutorial classes students will be divided into several groups as required.

The process of admission into all the courses begins with the notification issued by the Principal immediately after the announcement of respective results. Prospectus for admission can be obtained from the College Office on payment of the prescribed fee and the intending candidates are required to submit the completed Application Forms within prescribed time limit. Applications are processed and finalised by the 'Admission Committee'. The admission will follow on merit basis subject to seats available on the day notified for admission at scheduled time and venue.

RELAXATION OF MARKS:

- a) The candidates eligible for reservation shall be given relaxation upto 5% of the marks prescribed for admission except for physically handicapped students.
- b) Students, who have shown extra-ordinary proficiency in sports etc. at National, Regional, State or Varsity level may be offered seats for admission into various courses of studies subject to the availability of seats.
- c) Students having Grade in NCC / Scout.
- d) Descendents of teaching and non-teaching staff shall be admitted irrespective of percentage of marks

REGISTRATION AND MIGRATION :

Registration is compulsory for all students on submission of prescribed forms after admission under A.H.S.E.C. or G.U. and students from Boards or Universities other than S.E.B.A., A.H.S.E.C. or G.U. shall have to produce Migration Certificates at the time of admission.

ATTENDANCE :

Attendance is compulsory in all classes. Students shall be required to attend atleast 75% of lectures for theoretical and practical classes separately to become eligible to sit for the Final Examination, if not, otherwise disqualified for the same. However, for the students under semester course the attendance percentage will be governed as per the semester regulations.

CANCELLATION OF SEAT :

A student failing to attend classes for 30 (thirty) days at a stretch shall forfeit his or her seat.

ACADEMIC REGULATIONS:

The College follows the regulations prepared by A.H.S.E.C. and G.U. being in force from time to time in respect of concerned courses.

GENERAL RULES & REGULATIONS :

1. Every pupil of the institution & all Intra-institutional bodies shall be subject to general guidance and control as may be prescribed by the College Governing Body from time to time.
2. No student shall be admitted to any course of studies if he or she is found to have indulged in any activity considered detrimental to academic interest.
3. A student shall be subject to disciplinary action if he or she is found to be disobedient or indecent in his or her behaviour with the teaching and non-teaching staff.
4. A student who is found to have violated College Rules shall be liable to expulsion.
5. Only recognised bodies shall have the privilege to use the College Premises after obtaining formal permission from the Principal.
6. No notice or leaflet can be circulated anywhere in the College Premises without the approval of the Principal.
7. Admission fee and all other fees are to be paid at a time for the whole year on the day of admission.
8. Each Academic Session will run as per Academic Calendar embodied in the Prospectus.
9. Wearing of College Uniform is compulsory during College hours on all working days including days of College Week, Meetings, Examination etc.
10. Students entering the College Compound with armed-security is illegal and subject to disciplinary action.
11. The decision of the Principal on all matters relating to students shall be final and binding.
12. Mobile Phones are strictly prohibited during class and examination hours. Any violation is subject to severe disciplinary action.
13. Spitting/ Smoking/ Writing on walls, doors etc. in and around the college building is strictly prohibited. Any student detected doing so, is subject to expulsion from the college.
14. Ragging is strictly prohibited.

15. No student in any manner be involved in Ragging of any form inside the college campus and the hostel.
16. However, any student complained of being ragged will also be taken up by the competent authority.
17. Committee constituted by the Principal under his Chairmanship will be the competent authority to prohibit ragging or to take any action deem fit for the greater interest of the institution.
18. Ragging may invite the following action to curb the menace :

- Criminal offence as per law passed by a number of state governments.
- Rustication from the college.
- Embossment on Marksheet, Degree Certificate etc.
- Penalty and imprisonment of one year.
- Fine.

In the event of any complaint regarding ragging no one can plead ignorance to be excused from punitive action.
